### LEADERSHIP CORNER

#### **Making Decisions**

Every issue of the NV/CA Regional Newsletter features a brief synopsis of different leadership styles and skills found in the Phi Theta Kappa Leadership Development Studies curriculum. For this issue, we will examine *making decisions*.

Decision making can be defined as identifying and selecting a course of action in order to address a problem or to take a step toward an achievable goal. While not all of our decisions will have the desired results, we should employ a process using rational, intelligent, and systematic steps.

We make decisions frequently in our everyday lives, but as leaders we can also employ effective decision making skills in a group environment. According to Brent Gleeson, a writer on leadership and organizational excellence, there are four ways for leaders to make a decision:

- •Command Decision Making It involves a leader making a decision without consulting anyone else in the group or on the team. This style usually occurs with financial decisions or during crisis situations.
- •Collaborative This style is used when a leader solicits feedback from the group or team, and then the leader makes a final decision. One pitfall to be weary of is groupthink where a decision is based solely on the harmony of a group and the unanimity rather than the creative thinking process of alternatives.
- •Consensus A consensus strategy involves a group vote to make a decision rather than leaving the decision making to the leader. This process works well when the results of the decision involve the entire group.
- •Convenience A decision based on convenience encompasses allowing someone else to make a decision. The benefits to this style include measuring the abilities of the group members, empowering others, and freeing the leader from additional stress.

Which of these styles do you think would work well for you? Which would work well for your chapter or another group in which you are involved?

If you think certain situations call for different styles, you would be employing situational decision making skills.
